GREENHOUSE!

A greenhouse consisting of over 2,500 water bottles will be constructed this month at Carroll Senior High School as an essential component of a vegetable garden referred to as “pizza garden project”.

The pizza garden project was initiated by Michelle Kelly, a sophomore in Carroll ISD. Michelle is a participant of Best Buddies, H.O.P.E. program, and Girl Scouts of America. The pizza garden project will fulfill Michelle’s requirements for the Girl Scout Gold Award. This service project will involve and benefit students, foster a fun hands-on way of learning, instill an awareness of the environment and pass on a useful life skill.

In collaboration with Mrs. Lufkin, environmental science teacher, and Mrs. Scott, Life Skills teacher, the pizza garden will be maintained by the environmental science and life skill students. During each school year students will gain knowledge about soil, plant life and growth, gardening, organic vs. inorganic, and pesticides. At the end of the year the students will then make homemade pizza using all of the garden vegetables and spices grown throughout the year.

With the support of STUCO and volunteers such as Key Club, students, and staff, the water bottle collection is in full force. Due to the quantity needed, it is necessary to reach out to other district schools and the community for help. Presently, we have blue collection boxes at CSHS. The front office will accept large quantities.
